

HOW TO MEASURE CABINETS

Measure in Inches

Cabinets and Appliances are measured in inches, so your drawings should be recorded in inches. Not feet and inches.

Example: 138-1/8in, not 11-ft 6-1/8in

Appliances, Walls and Openings

When measuring for ceilings, walls, appliances and openings, round to the nearest 1/8in. Example: 36-1/8in, not 35-1/16in.

Recording Your Measurements

We've provided graph paper (located on the back of this page) to help with your drawing. It is much more important to record accurate dimensions than drawing your room to scale. Be sure to write the actual dimensions on your drawings for all the elements in your space. If this is a new build, please ensure all sheetrock is in place.


